Term 1 Overview - Kinder

School Focus: Believe: We live our Catholic faith through action, attitude and prayer guided by the Dominican Tradition.

Religion

The students will gather information about families and explore the relationship between family, school and parish. They will have an awareness that all people are loved by God and that they belong to their families and to a community of faith - the Church.

English

The students will explore the concepts of print and how the combination of print and images in texts create meaning. They will attempt to work out unknown words by combining contextual and phonic knowledge. They will recognise and generate rhyming words and patterns of alliteration in spoken words and texts. They will work towards recognising and naming all upper and lower case letters and know the most common sound that each letter represents. They will work towards knowing how to write their own name and those of other familiar people. They will discuss stories and authors and how they feel about what happens in stories and they will share personal experiences with the whole group.

Maths

The students will develop fluency with forwards and backwards counting, initially to 20 and from 20, and then moving from any starting point. They will create and describe patterns using materials, movements or drawings. The students will work towards knowing and identifying the days of the week and linking them to familiar events. They will sort, describe and name familiar two-dimensional shapes as well as follow and give simple directions. They students will also pose questions about themselves, collect information and make simple inferences based on the data collected.

Science

The students will explore and observe living things and understand that all living things have basic needs. They will use their five senses to make observations and record their findings in diagrams as well as verbally report to their peers.

Humanities and Social Sciences

The students will inquire about their own history and the lives, places and events of other family members. They will explore family photographs and family artefacts and describe events they have experienced or places they have visited which are special and important to them and their families.

Technologies

The students will identify and categorise a wide range of foods into groups and describe the tools and equipment needed to prepare these safely and hygienically for healthy eating. The students will also identify, gather and play with materials, tools and equipment to generate cards, books, posters, animal shelters and plant pots.

The Arts

The students will explore fundamental movement skills safely to improvise dance ideas, for example, jumping like a frog, stomping like a giant. They will develop an awareness of the boundaries of the dance space and become aware of moving with care and respecting others within the dance space.

The students will reflect on the styles and techniques of various artworks. They will follow technical processes and safe practices to create artworks and will use different art, craft and design styles from other cultures and times.

Music

Students will use singing, rhyme and movement activities to become aware of rhythm, beat and pitch (high and low notes).

Health and Physical Education

The students will explore actions that promote health, safety and wellbeing and identify the components they need to lead a healthy lifestyle.

The students will practice cooperative participation and sharing equipment and space during physical activities. They will begin to demonstrate fundamental movement skills using different body parts and complete activities within given timeframes.

Indonesian

Students will be introduced to Indonesian by exploring how language connects us to others. By learning about Indonesian they will discover that they communicate in English and possibly other languages. They will find out where Indonesia is in relation to Australia, discover who speaks Indonesian and learn some simple songs.
